WORKING FAMILIES ARE WELCOME!

See The World is a pilot program of the Cambridge Equity Collaborative. We would like to invite parents and guardians to participate in excursions with their families. It is sometimes difficult for low income families to justify spending money on excursions.

Too often immigrant parents pay for their lack of knowledge of social and political systems in currency of time up front and dollars later in life for their children. While my parents worked two or three jobs respectively, I spent my evenings and weekends at home watching television with my sisters instead of exploring museums, or national parks, or even the universities in Cambridge. This was not the experience of my wealthier schoolmates. We do not want parents to have to choose between paying their bills and spending time with their families. We are offering parents a \$150 stipend for participation in each day of See The World events.

ELIGIBILITY

- A Cambridge resident
- Have at least one child who is 10-12 years old at the Kennedy-Longfellow School.
- Kids whose families are eligibile for free or reduced school lunch.
